He asked for the Council to review and the minutes from the Council's last meeting since a quorum had been met. Since no changes were requested, Mr. Blackstone asked for a motion to approve the minutes. *A motion was made by Mr. Wachtel and seconded by Ms. Abbitt. Mr. Blackstone ask Ms. Wulliger to call the roll for accepting minute approval. All were in favor and the minutes were approved.*

Mr. Blackstone introduced Mr. Rob Jackson, the Ohio 9-1-1 Program Administrator, to provide the Council an overview of the relationship between Next Generation 911 and GIS. Mr. Jackson shared ESINet Steering Committee background with the Council. He then briefly explained where implementation stands at this point, the RFP, the Federal 911 grant offered to counties and highlighted a vague timeline regarding legislation and incorporating the core system that counties will be able to plug into once completed by the State-hired vendor. Mr. Jackson and Mr. Blackstone led a discussion regarding that status of counties around the state, identifying a dispatchable location, additional details of the process, resources available and implementation of the system. Mr. Blackstone thanked Mr. Jackson.

Mr. Blackstone updated the Council on the Ohio Statewide Imagery Program (OSIP III). The imagery collected has been completed for the state and that data has been published and downloaded to the OGRIP website. This completed OSIP III. The State contract addendum had a cooperative agreement which included a two-year extension to allow counties to purchase optional products. This extension begins this June and runs through 2023. Currently, there are approximately 14 counties who have opted to purchase additional products for the Spring.

Mr. Blackstone updated the Council on the status of the 3D Elevation Program (3DEP). Data has been collected for Phase I. The collection for Phase II started early February. Mr. Blackstone submitted a third proposal to USGS for Phase III, and the State of Ohio was awarded \$2.7 million for the Phase III. In addition, this project received dollar commitments from OEPA, ODOT and ODNR which makes the project fully funded. This means the State will receive high-resolution lidar and elevation data set for the whole state.

Charlie Hickman retired from USGS. Mr. Blackstone introduce his replacement Cynthia Rachol. Her title is an Associate National Map liaison. She will be keeping the Council apprised on USGS updates. She stated a 3DEP fact sheet will be distributed soon and that the 2019 lidar data available on the National Data Map now.

Mr. Blackstone updated the Council on OGRIP COVID Portals. This was not the State’s official COVID-19 portal, but OGRIP’s served a purpose. He encouraged the Council to look at if they have the chance. OGRIP worked with EMA and the site turned out to be a valuable tool.

Mr. Blackstone asked Mr. Ian Kidner to provide an update regarding the Location Based Response Systems (LBRS). Mr. Kidner shared that ODOT’s update of LBRS data for incorporation into ODOT’s Road Inventory Management System (RIMS).

Mr. Blackstone asked Mr. Donovan Powers to update Statewide Parcels. Annually ODNR asks counties to voluntarily submit copies of their updated data sets in order to create a statewide parcel data set. He currently has 75 counties providing data and eight have not responded.

Mr. Blackstone asked Jeff Jalbrzikowski from NOAA if he could update the Council. He shared that there is a webinar coming up focusing on vertical data. Check out their website for additional information.

Mr. Blackstone asked for any new business. Mr. Powers shared that ODNR and other state and local governments have been working together and are ready to soft launch trail data end of February. This application is web based and mobile covering all public access to trails for hiking and equestrian.

Additional new business consisted of Mr. Slater announced that he is stepping down from being a Council member. Mr. Blackstone also shared that Mr. Stolte and Mr. Yandrick were also stepping down. Bob Ward added that Mr. Magni will also be retiring. Mr. Blackstone thanked all of them for their years of service.
